

# BMB BoD Meeting Minutes

April 7, 2026 / 7:00 PM

## Attendees

## Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 7:12 PM.

## Minutes of Last Meeting

Board members reviewed the minutes of the March 4 meeting, and approved the minutes as submitted (motion: **Chuck**; second: **Gregg**).

## Monthly Reports

### President

**Chris** shared updates on lease agreement discussions with **Linda Zimmer** from County Parks. He had also been in touch with **Debbie** from Bowhunters Unlimited, as they are in the same process but a bit further along. **Debbie** had received a 74-page lease agreement draft from **Linda**. **Chris** had met with **Debbie** and her contract attorney and they had reviewed the lease agreement draft. They had noted that a lot of the draft agreement covers things that would not apply to archery clubs, and were planning on working further to iron out the lease agreement.

Regarding permits, **Chris** said that Santa Clara County Parks had had an audit recently, which explains why they're insisting on having permits filed for every event. He also noted that County Parks were changing the permit application process and moving to an online self-serve system, which would reduce a lot of the legwork he presently did for submitting permits.

**Chris** said he would be soon submitting permits for the Regional and State 900 tournaments and the June USAT-style event.

### Treasurer

Board members reviewed the club financials updates that **Ron** had provided.

### Secretary

**Tam** reported that there were 73 members joined or renewed for 2026 so far.

## SJSU Updates

**Thalia** reported that as she was graduating soon, she anticipated that **Grace** would be taking over as SJSU Archery president and BMB liaison. She added that **Grace** was working on finalizing the contract between BMB and SJSU.

**Thalia** said that she had been talking with **Curtis** (Predators Archery) about an archery event in San Jose with San Jose City Parks.

## Old Business

### Work Party

**Tam** reported that the prior weekend's work party had been rather lightly attended by BMB members, although around half a dozen volunteers from the SCC Parks program had shown up. He said that they had replaced some bales on various targets, and installed new hardware on some of the practice range targets to accommodate the larger bales. **Tam** added that he was considering how to upgrade the target frames on the upper 14 to accommodate the larger bales, so that it would no longer be necessary to trim back the corners of the bales to work with the current hardware.

### Tractor repairs

**Chris** said he had no updates to report.

### Tool Shed Termite Treatment

**Chris** said he hadn't heard back from **Shawn DeLong**, but would speak with him at the next 3D League event.

### Upper lot trailer repairs

**Tam** read the email report from **Ron**: a new set of doors had been installed, and are usable, though some trim and handles, etc. have yet to be installed. A motion by **Tam** (second: **Gregg**) to reimburse **Ron** \$258 for upper trailer repairs and 3D target repairs was approved.

### 3D target inserts

There were no updates from **Ron** about replacement inserts for 3D targets.

### 3D League

**Tam** said that he was working on coordinating volunteers for this week's event, in **Ron's** absence. **Gregg** asked if there were enough volunteers for setup and **Tam** said he believed so, adding that he would be there earlier than usual in case he was needed.

### April club shoot

**Tam** said that logistics for the upcoming Club Shoot had been up in the air, as he, **Chris**, **Ron**, and **Brandon** were all going to be away on that weekend. However, it turns out **Tam** will be present to run the event after all. **Tam** said that attendance might be light due to other events happening the same day, and due to the forecasted rainy weather.

## New Business

### June USAT-style event

**Chris** summarized the planned details of the USAT-style tournament: it would be a 2-day event on the weekend of June 13-14, with qualifying on the first day and elimination rounds on the second. Depending on attendance numbers, there would be separate morning and afternoon sessions. He added that there was not really enough space behind the shooting line to stage archers for team rounds; **Tam** added that even without team rounds, this was already a sufficiently ambitious step up from last year's USAT-style Club Shoot.

With regards to pricing, **Chris** said that the permit would cost around \$600, so something like \$30 for non-members would recoup costs and fund some small trophies for the event.

**Chuck** noted that the NFAA Field Sectionals were happening at **King's Mountain Archers** on June 14; **Chris** acknowledged this but said that this event was intended mainly for those planning to attend the USAT SoCal Showdown event later that month, and he said there would not be a significant overlap in potential attendees.

### Target trailer repairs

**Chris** said that the doors on the target container are sagging, making it difficult to put on its designated lock. He said that with some effort the doors could be lifted to the necessary alignment. **Tam** suggested looking at adjusting how the doors hang from the hinges.
